
Journey - Aaron Becker

Children will 'read' this picture book
telling the story through careful
observations of the wonderfully
sequenced adventure. Follow a girl from
her home in New York, through a door
that she made using her magic crayon.
Before long, children will tell their own
story whilst developing their oral
storytelling abilities. Journey encourages
children to make credible and exciting
predictions as well as increase their
vocabulary, encourage sequencing and
improve their narrative writing.

By the end of the unit the children will write their own adventure story based on 'Journey'. To do this they will use: prepositions, conjunctions, adverbs and present perfect form.

Journey by Aaron Becker will be used in Year 3 . Children will follow the story of a lonely girl who draws a door on her bedroom wall and steps into another world. Alded by her magic crayon she travels through this strange, new place. Shifting landscapes give way to a remarkable city where there's a villain to confront, and the girl needs all her courage and resourcefulness in order to survive. She does, of course, and goes home with the greatest treasure of all, a friend. The detailed illustrations take children on a 'journey', children begin to tell the story and soon forget the absence of written words.
