

Title: The three little pigs





Author: Mara Alperin and Miriam Latimer

Grapheme and meaning	Picture name	Phoneme phrase	Formation phrase
S 		Shoo! Squirrels are so cheeky and noisy in the trees.	Round the thumbs and index fingers and then the middle and ring fingers.
a 		Open your mouth wide and make the 'a' sound at the front of your mouth or in the middle.	Round the thumbs, index, middle and ring fingers.
t 		Open your lips like the top of your tongue when you say 't' and 'tch'.	Open the fingers' need to be held, then pull the fingers across the top.
p 		Hold your fingers together and push them out and squeeze.	Hold the fingers' need to be held, then pull the fingers across the top.
i 		pull your lips back and make a 'i' sound in the back of your mouth.	Open the fingers' need to be held, then pull the fingers across the top.
n 		Open your lips and make a 'n' sound in the middle of your mouth.	Open the fingers' need to be held, then pull the fingers across the top.
m 		Push your lips together and make a 'm' sound in the middle of your mouth.	Open the fingers' need to be held, then pull the fingers across the top.

Pencil grip

The pencil needs to be held between the index, middle fingers and thumbs. Fourth finger sometimes involved.
