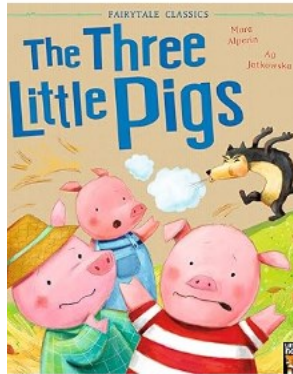

**Title:** The three little pigs

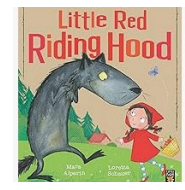
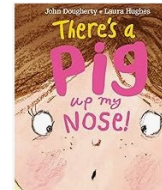
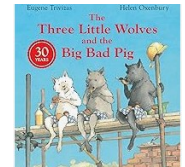
**Author:** Mara Alperin and Miriam Latimer

**Bellowed** - to shout loudly and with a deep tone

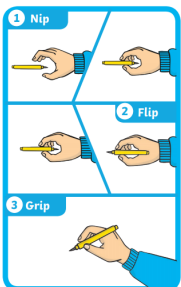
**Warning** - a sign of something bad

Grapheme and mnemonic	Picture card	Formation phrase	Formation phrase
s s S		Start your snake and curl on the s like the snake's body.	Start the snake 's', slide down and round to the left.
a a A		Open your snake wide and make the 'a' round at the back of your mouth as it.	Round the snake's body, and then into space.
t t T		Open your top hat and make the 't' round at the back of your mouth as it.	From the top's round to the left, then slide the snake across the left.
p p P		Bring your top hat round and make the 'p' round at the back of your mouth as it.	Round the pig's body, then up and round to the left.
i i I		Put your top hat and make the 'i' round at the back of your mouth as it.	Round the iguana's body, then the 'i' dot the top of the hat.
n n N		Open your top hat and make the 'n' round at the back of your mouth as it.	Round the nose's body, then the 'n' dot the top of the hat.
m m M		Open your top hat and make the 'm' round at the back of your mouth as it.	Round the mouse's body, then the 'm' dot the top of the hat.

## Pencil grip



The pencil needs to be held between the index, middle

fingers and thumbs. Fourth finger sometimes involved.
