Rules:

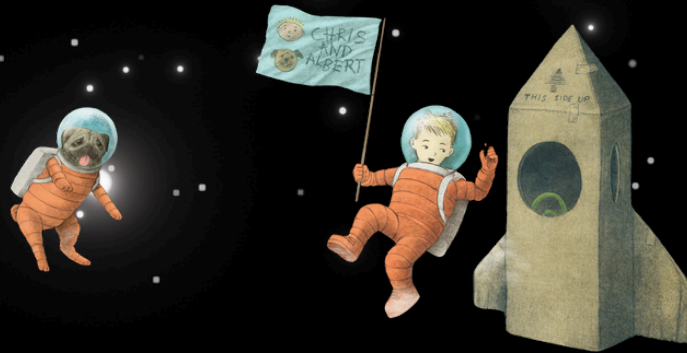
- Sentences must link

Subordinating Conjunction

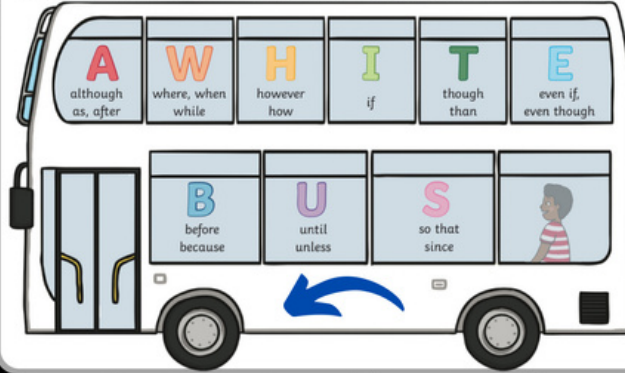
Despite ambitions to travel to space, Chris was afraid of the dark.



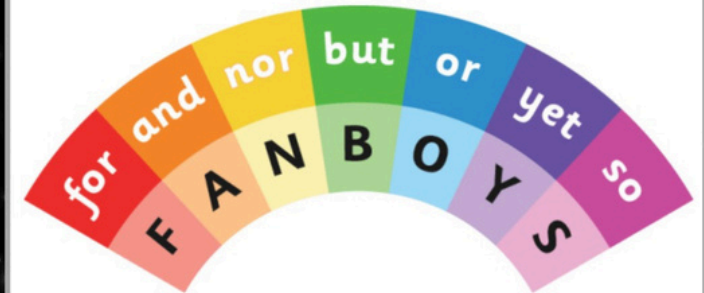
